Update: Full-Time Deputation as of June 2026

The past few months have been full, and we are grateful for how the Lord has kept us busy in His work. In May, as I was finishing my final weeks of employment, we attended several meetings closer to home in Texas and Oklahoma. Our desire in each meeting is to be a blessing to pastors and churches, encourage them in the work of missions, and share the burden God has placed on our hearts for Mexico. Again and again, the Lord has blessed us far beyond what we could have expected.

June Meetings and Encouragement

June brought a full schedule, with eight meetings in just two and a half weeks. As we traveled, the Lord provided for our needs and encouraged our hearts through His people. We were blessed by:

- Churches that provided lodging, often through mission apartments.
- Love offerings that helped cover expenses while we were on the road.
- Congregations that welcomed us warmly and listened with interest to our burden for Mexico.
- Pastors and church members who demonstrated a servant's heart.
- Believers who understood some of the difficulties and cultural challenges we will face in Mexico.

July Travel and God's Provision

We went straight into July with more meetings before returning home. In all, we were gone for 28 days, traveled about 5,400 miles, and had 10 meetings. Along the way, we visited churches of different sizes, each with its own unique personality.

We met some people for the first time, yet fellowshiped as though we were family. We met pastors who were also musicians, songwriters, and teachers. We saw people of all ages serving in many different capacities as the Lord led them.

We were also blessed to have a small part in a Vacation Bible School, where one person was saved and new visitors came to the church. Each church showed us genuine love. God knew how He would supply our needed support before He ever called us. Our desire is simply to be faithful as He leads and to watch Him show us how He has already answered our prayers (*Isaiah 65:24*).

Unexpected Open Doors

The Lord opened doors we could not have expected. When Crystal and our daughters sing, they include some Spanish lyrics so people can hear and enjoy the beauty of the language. At one service, we did not realize there was a person in the congregation who did not speak English. He was blessed to hear a song of praise in his own language.

Praise the Lord—God always knows what He is doing, even when we do not understand how He is working. Our responsibility is to obey Him and leave the increase in His hands.

On another occasion, while attending a midweek service out of state where we did not expect to present, the pastor asked us to take a few minutes to share our burden for Mexico. There we met a young lady from Mexico who was encouraged to hear that we will be working with friends who are dear to her heart and testimony. She was an unexpected blessing to us.



Sustained by God's Peace

We were tired at times, but God sustained us. We were frustrated at times, but God calmed our anxieties and concerns. *Philippians 4:6* says, ***"Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God."***

The cares mentioned here are worries and anxieties. God does not promise that they will never come, but He does give us His Word to assure us that He wants us to bring our cares to Him in prayer, with thanksgiving, trusting that He is able. God cannot lie (*Titus 1:2; Numbers 23:19; Hebrews 6:18*).

Jesus teaches us not to let the worries and cares of this world become our focus, because they draw our attention away from God. Instead, we are to seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, trusting that He will provide all that we need.
